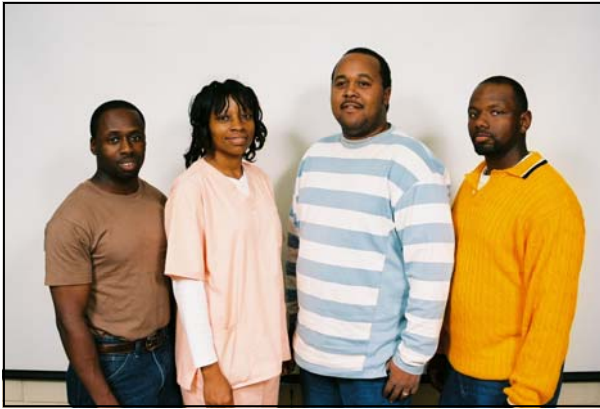

The Winston County Self Help Cooperative is nestled in the rolling hills of Louisville, MS. The cooperative's mission is to help save rural America by providing needed information to small and un-served landowners. Winston County Self Help Cooperative was founded in 1985 with three original members still active today. The cooperative's membership consist of 35 members with 33 percent females. According to statistics from USDA the average age of today's farmer is 62 and African American farmers 70 years old; however, Winston County Self Help Cooperative's average age is 44 years old. The cooperative is committed to training future generation of landowners by approaching farming from a holistic perspective. According to cooperative member Hubert Nicholson, "We are concerned about wellness, finance, education, housing, and social and economic well-being. The cooperative has taken a significant role in providing services to educate its members and the general public on creating a thriving environment for future generation of landowners. The cooperative membership consist of certified financial and home buyer counselors for the benefit of aiding needed families before and after major purchases. Additionally, the cooperative has sponsored wellness

events to raise the conscious of health issues and provided information on nutrition. This holistic approach has attracted several members under the age of 35 years old. Jacqueline Steele stated, "The cooperative has provided an opportunity for my family to reconnect with the natural resources and take advantage of the home buyer and financial education classes." Additionally, Jacqueline serves as assistant treasurer of the cooperative and leads the financial education unit. Winston County Self Help Cooperative Youth Group has been allowed intergenerational learning opportunities with the senior group. This has been a valuable tool to help transform our next generation of landowners according to Dorothy Harper, WCSHC Youth Director. We have 25 eager youth ready and committed to learn from our senior members and we are transferring this knowledge through our Youth Garden project. We are planning to institute a canning project with Mrs. Mattie Haynes in the spring. We have young parents who are unfamiliar with preserving fresh vegetables; therefore, this will be an opportunity to promote intergenerational learning. Winston County Self Help Cooperative is committed to help save rural America, and we are moving forward with our mission by connecting with the next generation of landowners.
