WCSHC and Winston County's NAACP hosted a homebuyer's workshop on November 19, at the extension office in Louisville, Ms. Evangelist Essie Jackson offered

words of encouragement and Charles Hampton highlighted the purpose with facts focused on home foreclosures. Hampton said, "Mississippi's foreclosure rate climbed 14 percent in recent months, therefore, we initiated this workshop to assistance families with obtaining information to prevent foreclosures". WCSHC membership declared support for the Mortgage Reform and Anti-Predatory Lending Act and they urge other organizations to solicit their U.S Representatives to support of this crucial piece of legis-

lation. Charles Harris Director of Housing Education Economic Development...a non-profit organization based in Jackson, Ms presented to more than fifty participants. Harris stated, "Individuals should participate in homebuyers education classes prior to purchasing a home." This will help equip individuals with internal knowledge to comprehend contract terms. "We are committed to help families purchase homes with a long-term goal of ownership."

“GIVE SPACE HEATERS SPACE.” Keep them at least 3 feet away from anything that can burn.
